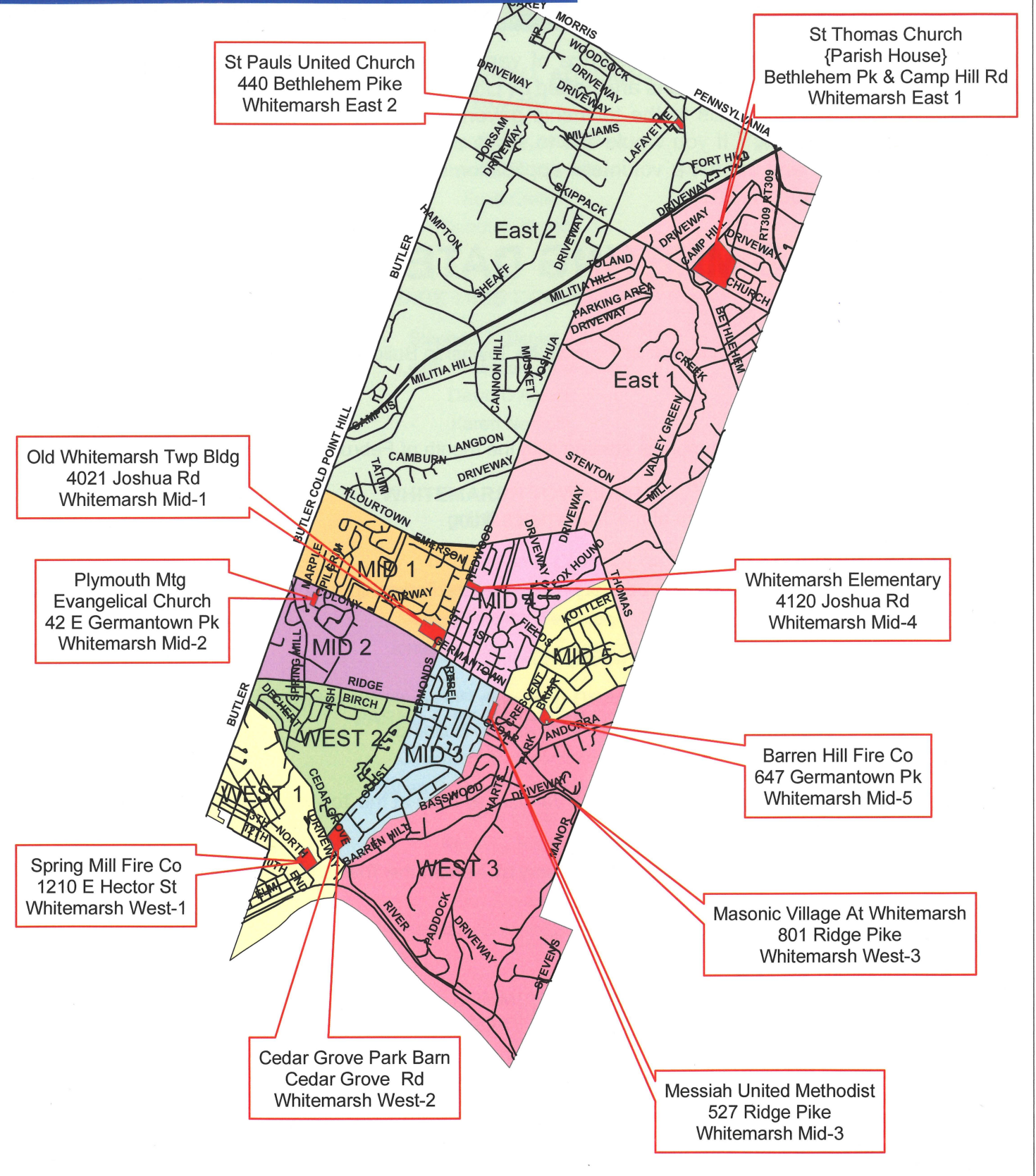
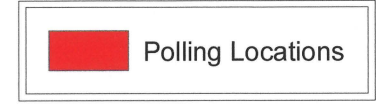

## New Township Supervisor:

On March 29, 2016, the Whitemarsh Township Board of Supervisors appointed Michael Drossner, a 13+ year resident of Whitemarsh Township, to fill the vacancy on the Board left by long-time Supervisor, Robert Hart upon his resignation in February of this year.



Mr. Drossner is an attorney with offices in Norristown and Philadelphia and just recently completed his term as President of the Villanova Law Alumni Association. As a member of the Montgomery Bar Association, Mr. Drossner is an active participant in their Civics Program whereby he teaches a monthly civics class to students at Eisenhower Middle

School in Norristown, and he previously served as the Deputy Chief Public Defender for Montgomery County.

In the local community, he serves as a commissioner and coach of the Whitemarsh Youth Basketball League as well as coach in the Whitemarsh Girls Basketball League, Whitemarsh Girls Softball League and Whitemarsh Little League, and he previously served as a Judge of Elections from 2009 - 2013. In addition, Mr. Drossner serves as Vice-President of his synagogue, Beth Tikvah-B'nai Jeshurun, in Erdenheim, and he is on the Executive Committee for the J. Willard O'Brien American Inn of Court at Villanova Law School, a professional organization comprised of Judges, lawyers and law students.

Mr. Drossner holds a Master's Degree in Trial Advocacy (LL.M.) from Temple University Law School, a traditional law degree (J.D.) from Villanova University School of Law, and he obtained a B.A. from Penn State.

## Zoning Hearing Board:

Zoning classifications ("districts") dictate what use can be made of a particular property. Zoning regulations, for example, will ensure that a noisy bar/restaurant is not built on the lot next to your home, in a residential district. Zoning regulations also specify where buildings can be placed within a lot by providing minimum yard setbacks. They also include other dimensional requirements such as the maximum area of a lot that may be occupied by buildings and pavement (impervious coverage), and maximum building height. By regulating zones, the Township can protect the public's interests by preventing certain land uses in one property from negatively affecting other members or properties in the community. Zoning regulations improve the safety, health, and welfare of all residents. It can also help stimulate economic development, preserve property values, optimize traffic flow, keep the Township beautiful, and protect the environment, among many other things.

At times, however, a property owner who wishes to make a change to their property might find it difficult to meet one or more requirement of the property's particular zone due a physical hardship (shape of lot, location of existing development, presence of a stream, etc.). In such case, a 'variance' may be sought from the Zoning Hearing Board. The Zoning Hearing Board is the only body that can hear and grant variance cases relating to zoning regulations. It is a quasi-judicial body appointed by the Township Board of Supervisors to serve five-year overlapping terms. It is a five-member body, with one alternate, the members of which are all interested residents of Whitemarsh Township.

The Zoning Hearing Board is the only board that can also hear requests for special exception uses. These are uses which are listed as special exception uses in the various zoning districts. For example, a restaurant is a special exception use in the general commercial districts, whereas a regular retail use is

a permitted use. In the institutional overlay district, all uses are by special exception—schools, places of worship, and museum, etc. The Zoning Hearing Board determines, based on testimony presented, whether the specifically proposed use meets all the standards required for it by the Zoning Ordinance and determines whether it will be consistent with the public health, safety and general welfare.

All of the Board's cases are heard at public hearings where all testimony is recorded by a court stenographer. The Zoning Hearing Board can attach reasonable conditions to any of its approvals. In addition to variance and special exception cases, the Zoning Hearing Board is required by law to hear certain appeals from determinations of the Zoning Officer and Township Engineer and to hear challenges to the validity of specific provisions of the Zoning Ordinance.

The Whitemarsh Township Zoning Hearing Board meets the first Wednesday of every month and also reserves the second Wednesday in the event a second evening is needed to hear additional applications or continued cases. # Open Space Update:

The Whitemarsh Township Board of Supervisors, at their March 10, 2016 Public Meeting, adopted Ordinance #964, authorizing the purchase of 11.36 acres of real property at Joshua Road for the preservation of the site as open space (see map below - property outlined in green). The funds for the purchase of the open space were from the Township's Act 153 Open Space Fund, which was established back in 2006 through a referendum. Act 153 gives local governments authority to use the Open Space Fund for the purpose of acquiring agricultural conservation easements as well as recreation or historic lands. The Township used Act 153 funds back in 2009 to purchase the 98 acres of farm land that comprises the Angust Tract

of Erdenheim Farm and in 2011 to purchase 22.83 acres of open space known as the Gambone Open Space (Cedar Grove & Wells St) in addition to other open space preservation opportunities throughout the Township over the years.

The 11.36 acres of open space recently acquired, known to many as the Joshua Hill property, was initially proposed for townhouse development. This property was identified as a potential open space preservation opportunity in the Township's 2006 Open Space Plan, which is a requirement to utilize the Act 153 funds. The Township's Open Space Plan is part of the Township's Comprehensive Plan, which serves as a policy tool for the Township to guide future growth and redevelopment.

Leave electronics out on the front curb next to the yard waste for the Township PW crew pick up. Do not leave out earlier than Tuesday night. All electronics for collection must be out by 6 AM Wednesday, September 28.

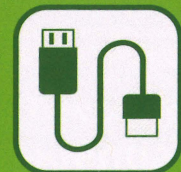

### "ALLE-WASTE ARE **NOT** MADE EQUAL"

Electronics Recyclers are capable of recycling almost anything with an electrical cord or that operates on battery. However, some products are costlier than others to recycle. Cost-effective products help offset the high cost of recycling cost-prohibitive products such cathode ray tubes (CRT) found in old TVs and monitors, which contain harmful toxic wastes like lead and mercury.

Pennsylvania's COVERED DEVICE RECYCLING ACT, which took effect in 2013, outlawed the dumping of electronic waste in landfills. With reduced options for recycling, there is now a high demand for electronic recycling programs.

By recycling your electronics -- especially those cost-effective products such as computers, cell phones, game consoles, etc. that help offset the increasing costs of recycling products like TVs and monitors -- you are helping create a sustainable future for Whitemarsh Township.





## 2016 FALL LEAF COLLECTION:

Every fall, the Township Public Works Department provides leaf collection service to the residents of the Township. For **2016, the fall leaf collection begins on Monday, October 17 and will continue until Monday, December 19.** The Township Public Works Department will make every effort to collect from each street at least once per week. All leaves for last pick up must be piled out on the streets by 6:30 a.m. on Monday, December 19.

Residents are asked to pile the leaves onto the curb for the Township Public Works Department to collect - **leaves are not to be bagged.**

## LEAF COMPOST PROGRAM

The leaves collected each fall by the Whitmarsh Public Works Department is then ground up and set in windrows to be turned into compost. Once the compost is ready, the Township make the compost available to residents to purchase at \$12/yard or double ground mulch for \$15/yard. Double ground mulch is made up of yard waste and brush debris that the Public Works Department have collected in previous years. Double ground mulch degrades at a favorable rate to return nutrients to the soil, proving to be beneficial to the health of trees.

The Township Public Works Department delivers compost orders for three yards or six yards per order.

Residents who would like to order delivery of compost should call the Township at 610-825-3535 and speak with the receptionist.

Compost is usually available for delivery by the beginning of spring of each year.

# Recycle RIGHT



## Did You Know?

It costs environmental service providers and local governments **MILLIONS** of dollars each year to remove contaminants.



Environmental service providers are forced to discard entire batches that could have been recycled if they are overly contaminated.



Improper recycling practices means that much of what you throw in the recycling bin could end up in landfills or incinerators if you're not careful!

## Acceptable Materials

Residential Guide to **SINGLE STREAM** recycling.

### GLASS

Glass Bottles and Jars, Glass Food Containers, Glass Beverage Containers

### CANS

Aluminum and Metal Cans, Loose Metal Jar Lids, Steel Bottle Caps, Foil

### PAPER

Newspapers, Magazines, Brochures, Corrugated Cardboard & Paper Bags, Paper Towel Rolls, Cartons, Mail, Paperboard Boxes, Office Paper

### PLASTICS

#1, #2, #4, #5 and #7 Plastics, Including Food and Beverage, Containers, Bottles, Jars, Jugs, etc.

## Common Contaminants

Contaminants that should **NOT** be included with your recycling!



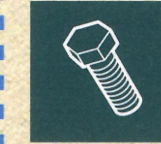
### PLASTIC BAGS

Plastic bags clog machinery and force sorting facilities to shut down. You may recycle clean, dry, and empty bags at participating grocery stores or appropriate drop-off centers.



### SHREDDED PAPER

Shredded paper is too small to sort. Pieces may fall inside the sorting machines and stick to the belts. Please avoid shredding when possible because it destroys the potential for recycling.



### SCRAP METAL

Scrap metal items of any size should not go into your curbside bin. These items cause excessive damage to the recycling equipment.



### HAZARDOUS WASTE

Hazardous waste such as paint, automotive fluids, car batteries and pesticides must be taken to your local Hazardous Waste Facility, not to the Recycling Center.



### DIAPERS OR BIO-HAZARDOUS WASTE

Syringes and needles, diapers and other sanitary products, even if they are made of plastic or paper products, should not be recycled because of the dangers they pose.



### STYROFOAM AND NONRECYCLABLE PLASTICS

Many plastics are still not recyclable. Plastic lids, foam (Styrofoam®) and any other plastics are not recyclable because stable markets do not exist for these materials.



### CRUSHED OR FLATTENED CONTAINERS

The single-stream sorting equipment separates "flats" (paper) from "rounds" (containers). The equipment sends flattened materials with the papers, contaminating those batches.



### CAPS/LIDS ON GLASS BOTTLES OR JARS

Metal lids can be removed and recycled loose in the bin. Plastic lids and caps from glass bottles and jars should be thrown away.



### LIQUIDS

When machines compact bottles for shipping, liquids drip, splatter and explode all over the floor, creating a sticky, smelly mess on the sorting floor and contaminate other materials.



### FOOD CONTAINERS

Food residue can contaminate boxes or other recyclable materials. Frozen food boxes also contain a protective coating that does not break down in the recycling process.



### WHEN IN DOUBT, THROW IT OUT!

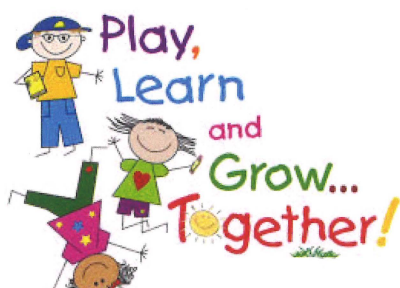
There are many other materials that could hinder the recycling process. It's better to be safe than risk contaminating entire batches that could otherwise have been recycled.
